I.	Call to Order Co-Chair Nancy Borchard called the meeting to order at 10:05 a.m.		
II.	Approval of the Agenda Ms. Borchard asked the Committee to review and approve today's agenda. David Deutsch moved to approve, Mark Schumacher seconded. The motion passed unanimously.	The agenda was approved as written. M/S/C	
III.	Approval of the Minutes Ms. Borchard asked the committee to review and approve the minutes of the May 3, 2018 meeting. Mark Schumacher moved to approve, John Schipper seconded. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Sheri Valley noted that in item IX.A. the name of the church is Camarillo Christian Church; the address is correct. 2. Ms. Borchard noted that item IX.F. contains a misspelling; the tiny houses are Tough Sheds. 3. Denise Noguera asked that the first sentence in item IX.C.2. read "VCAAA houses a program in partnership with the District Attorney's office Victims Assistance Unit." The motion to approve the minutes as amended passed unanimously.	The minutes were approved as amended. M/S/C	
IV.	Welcome and Introductions Ms. Borchard welcomed everyone and asked for introductions.		
V.	Public Comments None.		
VI.	Chair Announcements Gane Brooking noted that the NAMI California conference she attended included a presentation on Feedback Informed Care. Kaiser Permanente has implemented this and has seen significant improvement in clients. Ms. Brooking is planning to advocate for its implementation within VCBH. John Schipper noted that VCBH is considering implementing Feedback Informed Treatment (FIT), an outcome measure that can enhance treatment.		
VII.	Presentation: Human Services Agency's Homeless Services Program – Chris Russell, Program Manager The Homeless Services Program is part of the County's Continuum of Care and Pathways to Home, a federally-mandated program that provides a similar approach to services regardless of where people apply for help. People are considered homeless when they are living in a place that is not meant for human habitation, regardless of the length of time. Those considered chronically homeless have lived		

	<p>in such places for one year or longer consecutively or have had four episodes of living in that situation over the last three years. Additionally, they have to have a diagnosable physical or mental disability, with supporting documentation.</p> <p>The staff of 15 serves people who are homeless or at risk of being homeless countywide. Clients are asked what services they are seeking. Many are not interested in emergency shelter. They may want transitional housing, such as RAIN in Camarillo, which is mostly for families. Permanent year-round emergency shelters are limited, especially for adults with children.</p> <p>Through Rapid rehousing and homelessness prevention, the program can cover some expenses to get people into their own place. Clients receive at least six months of case management. During the last fiscal year, 211 households were funded, and 92% were successful in maintaining their housing for six months.</p> <p>Funds are available for CalWORKs homeless families and homeless disabled. The program can cover the first month of rent for people who are approved for General Relief but have not yet received their first payment.</p> <p>See attached brochures called Resources for Homeless People, Western and Eastern Ventura County versions.</p>		
VIII.	<p>Old Business</p> <p>A. Committee Membership – Appoint Members Ms. Borchard noted that she will appoint members based on regular attendance. Everyone is welcome to attend the meetings, and changes to the membership list will be made as appropriate.</p> <p>B. Older Adults Needs Ms. Borchard noted that the BHAB General Meeting of May 21st included a discussion about the feasibility of organizing an Older Adult Committee. The consensus of the board is to not do so but rather, let the Adult Services Committee focus on this population during its regular meetings, perhaps monthly or quarterly. Mark Schumacher noted that the cultural diversity subcommittee for older adults will hold a meeting on June 11 in the morning. Dr. Schipper noted that VCBH has an Older Adult program, which provides intensive services to about 90 clients. Additionally, the outpatient clinics serve older adult clients, although the number of such clients is unknown.</p> <p>C. Committee Objectives for Fiscal Year 2018-19 Ms. Borchard noted that the committee's objective # 1 for 2018-19 that was approved on May 3rd needs to be reviewed due to updates at the Hillmont Psychiatric Center. See draft 2. This will be revisited at the next meeting.</p>		
IX.	<p>Members and Participants Comments</p> <p>David Deutsch invited all to the next day's Prism of Thought, an artistic exploration of LGBTQ mental health and opinion. Several state representatives will attend. See flyer for details.</p> <p>Kalie Matissek noted that there are three openings at the Veterans transitional housing. This program has a total of 15 beds. Ms. Matissek also noted that Cheryl Malinowski will transition to Long Beach, and a new regional director will come onboard.</p> <p>Mark Schumacher noted that Turning Point's contract for Growing Works will start on July 1st. Staff is in the process of getting the nursery up and running. Quality of Life, Wellness Center, and four RISE recovery coaches continue their work.</p> <p>Dana Secor is accepting referrals to the rehabilitation programs, either the Oxnard Club House or the New Vision Center in Ventura. This program accepts VCBH clients only; it is open from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Monday through Friday.</p>		

	<p>Denise Noguera was asked by the Ventura and Oxnard Housing Authority to share a request for letters of support for a grant for vouchers that would help low-income disabled families; she will send the letter to the BHAB assistant for dissemination. Ms. Noguera also noted that she will be out for a few months.</p> <p>Andrew Huizar noted that Hillmont House and the Crisis Residential Treatment (CRT) are currently full. The average length of stay at the CRT is 14 to 21 days.</p> <p>Pam Roach noted that more family members are attending the orientations that she provides at the clinics.</p>		
X.	<p>Update: Behavioral Health Adult Division – Dr. John Schipper Dr. Sevet Johnson has been selected as the new VCBH Director. On July 1st Assist will be run internally by VCBH rather than being contracted out, Growing Works will start, and so will a grant for outreach with law enforcement and the Transitional Age Youth (TAY).</p>		
XI.	<p>Update: Behavioral Health Substance Use Disorders – Anna Flores The Alcohol and Drug Programs Division is scheduled to go live with Drug Medi-Cal Organized Delivery System (DMC-ODS) on December 1st. The Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) will come in July to check that the system is ready and approve it for use by VCBH and its contractors.</p>		
XII.	<p>Adjourn The meeting adjourned at 12:05 p.m. Ms. Borchard reminded all that the committee is going dark in July.</p>
