V.	Chair Announcements Cmdr. Nelson noted that he is looking forward to chairing this committee. Cmdr. Nelson attended the Stepping Up Initiative, attended by teams from 53 of the 58 counties in California. The aim of the initiative is to reduce or eliminate the number of mentally ill persons in county jails. As a commander with the Sheriff's Office, he runs the Todd Road jail.	Information

VII.	Presentation: Housing resources – Erin Locklear, Interface Ms. Locklear distributed a list of contacts and phone numbers that Interface uses when answering the phone. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A. Interface commonly utilizes the resources of several providers: TAY Tunnel, Community Action, Salvation Army, and the Kingdom Center. B. TAY face challenges when entering shelter. They also tend to feel they do not belong in the housing alternatives that are available, as they are tailored to the adult population. They need a lot of reassurance from their support system, including their case managers. C. Once a week the Ventura County Continuum of Care (CoC)'s Coordinated Entry System (CES) meets. It uses a vulnerability index to prioritize the TAY into transitional housing, emergency housing and other short-term housing. Ms. Locklear encouraged more mental health representation on the CoC, 		

	<p>especially from Transitions staff. Sevet Johnson volunteered to be added to the mailing list.</p> <p>D. Interface can assess TAY wherever they are, except in their home.</p> <p>E. Interface can link TAY to various long-term housing options, but there are waiting lists.</p> <p>F. On January 27 the point-in-time survey of homeless youth will be conducted county-wide.</p> <p>G.
