I.	Call to Order Chair Nielsen called the meeting to order at 10:05 a.m.		
II.	Approval of the Agenda Ms. Nielsen asked the Committee to review and approve today's agenda. Gina Petrus moved to approve, Martie Miles seconded. The motion carried unanimously.	The agenda was approved as written. M/S/C	
III.	Approval of the Minutes Ms. Nielsen asked the committee to review and approve the minutes of the May, 2019 meeting. Lori Litel moved to approve, Ms. Petrus seconded. The motion carried unanimously.	The minutes were approved as written. M/S/C	
IV.	Welcome and Introductions Ms. Nielsen welcomed everyone and asked for introductions.		
V.	Chair Announcements A. Ms. Nielsen reminded all that the committee voted to go dark in July. Ms. Nielsen noted she will be unable to attend the August 14 meeting and asked Ms. Petrus to chair that meeting; Ms. Petrus agreed. B. The Church of Latter Day Saints is partnering with non-profit agencies that can offer job opportunities for the Church's missionaries who have intellectual disabilities. Agencies that may be able to partner can contact Ms. Nielsen.		
VI.	Public Comments None.		
VII.	Presentation: Gold Coast Health Plan Care Management – Julianne Block; Beacon Health Options: Medi-Cal Managed Care Mental Health Benefits – Elizabeth Theis Gold Coast Health Plan Care Management is member-centric multi-disciplinary team. Anyone can make referrals, and members can self-refer. Case management services are provided on a short-term basis, often a few months, until the issue is resolved. Transportation can be provided door-to-door for medical, dental, psychiatry and pharmacy needs. Beacon Health Options' Medi-Cal Managed Care Mental Health Benefits are provided to Gold Coast Health Plan members with mild to moderate needs. For clients with moderate to severe needs, Beacon refers to VCBH the same day that the parents agree to the referral. Due to a nationwide shortage of child psychiatrists, the wait time for children to see a psychiatrist for an initial meeting is longer than for adults. Telemedicine is used to provide services for members who have difficulty accessing care. It can be done by video-conferencing from home or a clinic.		

	<p>Although Beacon has been purchased by Anthem, no changes are currently anticipated.</p> <p>See attached for details.</p> <p>Crystal Cummins thanked Gold Coast Health Plan for helping First 5 grandparents and other caretakers. Dina Olivas noted that it is effective for staff to help families who may be hesitant to call Gold Cost and connect to services. Marika Collins requested data on time to service. Heather Davidson noted that the screening form may miss some symptoms that children ages 0-5 exhibit, which are different from older children’s symptoms. Dr. Graff noted that there is cooperation between Beacon and Tri-Counties Regional Center, although there can be delays for diagnostic evaluations. He noted that the transitions to the new law has been smooth thanks to the excellent dialogue with Beacon.</p>		
<p>VII.</p>	<p>New Business</p> <p>A. Appoint/Remove Members Ms. Nielsen appointed Joe S. Ramirez to the committee. He is a member of the BHAB.</p> <p>B. Annual Report Preparation: Review Mission, Set Objectives for Fiscal Year 2019-20 The committee decided to keep its mission as is and to carry its current objectives over to FY 2019-20.</p>		
<p>VIII.</p>	<p>Ventura County Behavioral Health (VCBH) Youth & Family Division Updates</p> <p>A. Youth & Family Division – Dina Olivas, Senior Manager</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. At the California Mental Health Advocates for Children and Youth (CMHACY) conference in May, VCBH presented on the Continuum of Care Reform interagency collaboration and system process improvement for foster youth. Since then, other counties have contacted VCBH and requested information to help them improve their collaboration with their local Human Services Agencies. 2. Educationally Related Social Emotional Services (ERSES) clinicians will continue to provide services and support to families both in clinics and in the home. 3. CalWORKs staff are embedded at the Job & Career Centers of America, where they provide mental health education to men and women who are receiving employment support. 4. VCBH continues to provide support to group homes that are transitioning to become treatment programs as part of the Continuum of Care Reform. <p>B. Youth & Family Division – Lisa Acosta, M.D., Medical Director, Youth & Family Division</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Dr. Acosta continues to participate in the Child Death Review Team, which reviews circumstances surrounding the death of local children and youth under 18. May was drowning awareness month. 2. Planet Fitness is offering free membership to teens ages 15-18, May 15 - September 1st. 3. VCBH is switching provider for psychiatric services, from Sterling to Traditions Behavioral Health effective July 1st. Each current psychiatrist will have to decide whether to make the switch or seek other employment. Dr. Acosta will leave VCBH. 4. A certified eating disorders registered dietician has been hired. Monthly training continues for the 19 eating disorder therapists. The committee thanked Dr. Acosta for all the work she has done to get the eating disorder group going. <p>C. Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) – Hilary Carson, Program Administrator, Innovations</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. VCBH and the Ventura County Office of Education (VCOE) are working on a large contract. 2. The MHSA team is working on its 3-Year Plan. Information will be coming. 3. Dr. Kathleen Ryan is releasing a poster of words and phrases that denote rejection of the members of the LGBTQ+ community. The poster is suitable for display in clinics’ waiting rooms. 		

IX.	<p>Committee Members' and Participants' Comments, Activities, Updates Gina Petrus requested a presentation on the Continuum of Care Reform.</p> <p>Heather Davidson noted that her program is in the middle of a transition. If parents are currently connected to a Neighborhood for Learning (NfL), they can sign up for updates to find out which locations will be available.</p> <p>Lori Litel noted that United Parents has received a large increase in its budget for its respite program. This will allow the organization to offer the respite program to a larger number of parents and caregivers.</p> <p>Juliann Block noted that Gold Coast Health Plan will have a health fair at the downtown park in Oxnard. It will provide a variety of resources.</p>

	<p>transporte puerta a puerta para necesidades médicas, dentales, psiquiátricas y de farmacia.</p> <p>Los beneficios de salud mental de Medi-Cal Managed Care de Beacon Health Options se proporcionan a los miembros de Gold Coast Health Plan con necesidades leves a moderadas. Para clientes con necesidades moderadas a severas, Beacon se refiere a VCBH el mismo día en que los padres aceptan la referencia. Debido a la escasez nacional de psiquiatras infantiles, el tiempo de espera para que los niños vean a un psiquiatra para una reunión inicial es más largo que para los adultos.  - Member's Care Team (family, guardians, PCPs, specialists)
 - GCHP Care Management Team
 - Registered Nurse Care Managers
 - Licensed Clinical Social Worker Care Managers
 - Care Management Coordinators

- Through telephonic interactions Care Management utilizes person centered planning and collaboration with the member to address member's stated health and psychosocial needs

Care Management Process



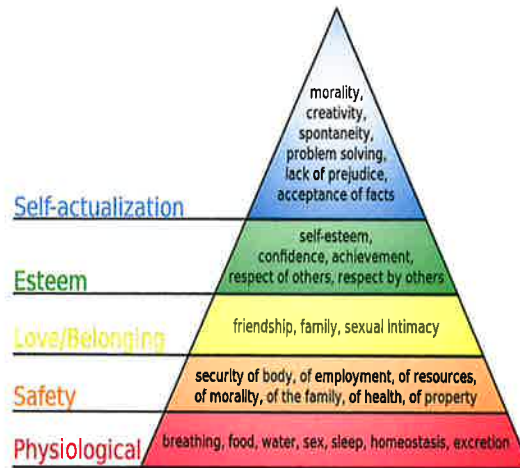
- Non-Complex Care Management

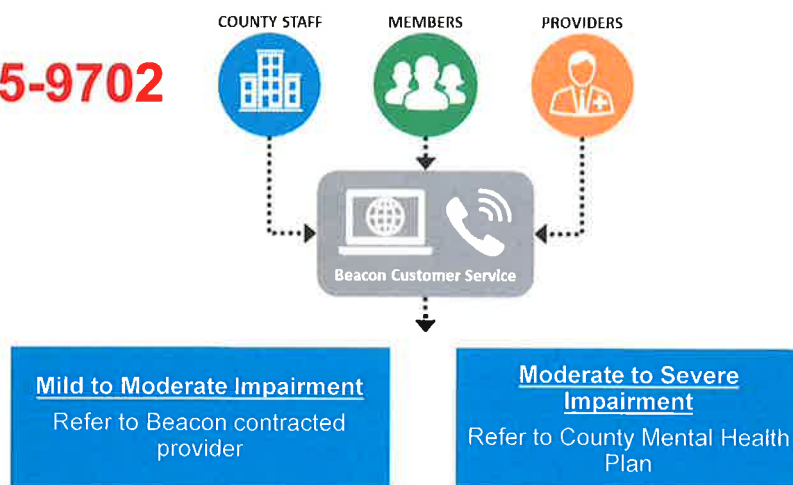

ABA/BHT Eligibility Criteria

- Requires prior authorization
- Member must be under 21 years of age
- A licensed MD or psychologist can prescribe ABA for any diagnosis
- Be medically stable
- Be without need for 24-hour medical/nursing monitoring or procedures provided in a hospital or intermediate care facility for persons with intellectual disabilities

2018-19 Objectives

1. Continuum of Care

- a. Follow and evaluate the implementation of the Continuum of Care Reform (CCR). Identify further needs or gaps in services to children in foster care.
- b. Monitor the Crisis Stabilization Unit. Identify remaining gaps in the continuum of crisis services for both children covered by Medi-Cal and children with private insurance.
- c. Advocate for the availability of psychiatric hospital beds in the county for the pediatric population. Ensure communication and care coordination of medical information between care providers.

2. Community and Parent Outreach

- a. Engage community agencies to schedule presentations regarding the role and activities of this Committee.
- b. Recruit community members to serve on the Committee, and inform families about mental health services available.
- c. Create innovative strategies to learn about parents/caregivers' needs and concerns.
- d. Raise awareness of alcohol and drug use information. Actively disseminate alcohol and drug use prevention information to the community partners, including community-based organizations (CBOs), law enforcement, and school districts.
- e. Maintain the availability of relevant materials on the Ventura County Behavioral Health's [wellnesseveryday/saludsiempre](#) website.
- f. Continue to oversee the development of the family resource app.
- g. Raise awareness of services for children ages 0-5 and access to those services.
